First Folio on Display

Birmingham's copy of the First Folio is unique because it is the only one bought as part of a dedicated programme for improving people's lives through culture and education. It was purchased in 1881 for all the people of Birmingham to access - no matter what their background, wealth or occupation. It is the first printed edition of Shakespeare's collected plays. The First Folio Tour has visited 16 venues - from community spaces to libraries and heritage venues.
